We believe in libraries. We believe that learning and access to information is a human need and a human right. Libraries create a community space for learning, for thinking and for being.



This year, we engaged our community to think about the future for the Kellogg-Hubbard Library by contributing to our strategic planning process. Our board and staff, along with 160+ members of our community, have been envisioning the next 3-5 years for KHL. We expect to unveil our new strategic plan this fall and we look forward to sharing this collective vision with you.

When we look back on the fiscal year that just finished, it was another year marked by the many challenges and opportunities of the Covid pandemic. Last fall we adjusted to the Delta variant and then in the winter readjusted as the Omicron surge took hold in our community. Through it all, our intrepid staff continued to provide a full slate of library services and we kept our building open to the public. Covid-related grant funds gave us the opportunity to make some necessary technology upgrades and to add new outdoor seating for patrons to gather, read, access wifi, and participate in outdoor programs.

In June, we celebrated the 1-year anniversary of eliminating overdue fines, a change welcomed by our patrons and supported financially by a dozen local businesses. June also marked the 1-year opening of our new always-open book sale, a very popular change that has provided a steady, reliable stream of income for the library.


As an organization, we have prioritized learning about diversity, equity and inclusion best practices for libraries and have begun incorporating this at many levels in the library. You may have noticed our "Where in the World Map" in the School Street stairwell which indicates all the places that KHL patrons are from and/or travel to with library materials. It's incredible to realize how many places KHL connects to across the planet.

When you stop to think about your future, what role do libraries play in your personal vision? Can you imagine a world without an open space to borrow materials, access online resources, attend programs or just simply spend time in? The space that libraries play in each community is vital and we are doing everything we can to ensure a vibrant and inclusive future for KHL.

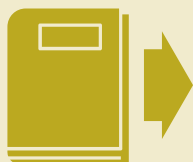

President's Report

The Kellogg-Hubbard Library is a 21st century library in a 19th century building. During our board's strategic planning retreat in June, we considered the beauty, the joys, and the limitations of our historic home.

Our building graces downtown

Montpelier with its elegant façade and inviting lawn. But it is expensive to heat and difficult to cool. It is as comfy a place to curl up with a book as you'll find. But the layout is traditional—better suited to book browsers than patrons needing remote work space. We have space for children to play, for art, and for community gatherings. But building maintenance needs are never-ending. Our building is, in short, both a beloved asset and a challenge as we look to a sustainable, innovative future.

And we are looking to the future and asking you, our patrons and supporters, to do the same. What is the mission of a 21st century library in small town Vermont? What steps can we take to make the Library more inclusive and welcoming to all? How do we balance change with tradition? For me, the building frames these questions: what will it look like in 25 years? 50? What will the people inside be doing? How will our communities have changed, and the Library with them?

We have the luxury to ponder the future only because our co-directors, staff, and board have ably led the Library through two challenging years and our communities and generous donors have supported this vital community institution. Many of you shared your views as we began the strategic planning process and we hope you will continue to do so as the process continues. And I hope you will also stop by the Library, perhaps sit on the steps or one of our new outdoor chairs, and think about who will be sitting there in 50 years.

While it's difficult to ascertain what the new norm will be for the operations of the Kellogg Hubbard Library, it is evident the Library has responded well to both the challenges and opportunities of the past two years.

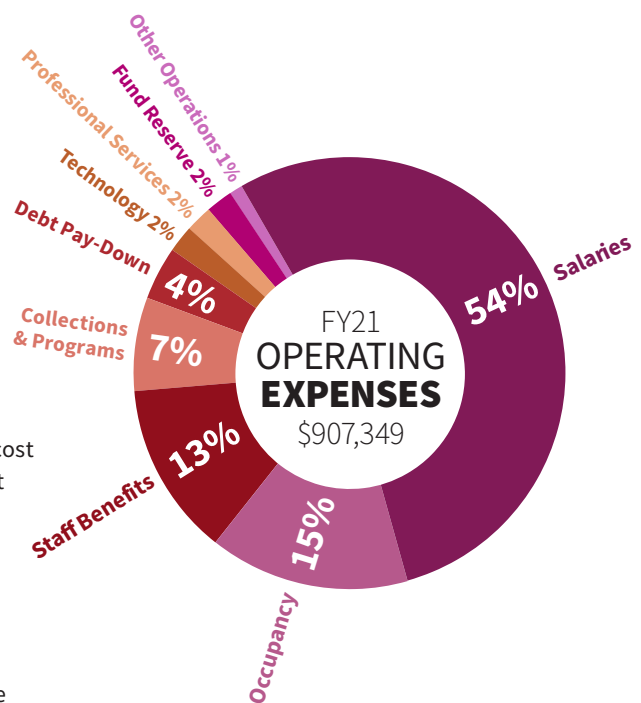
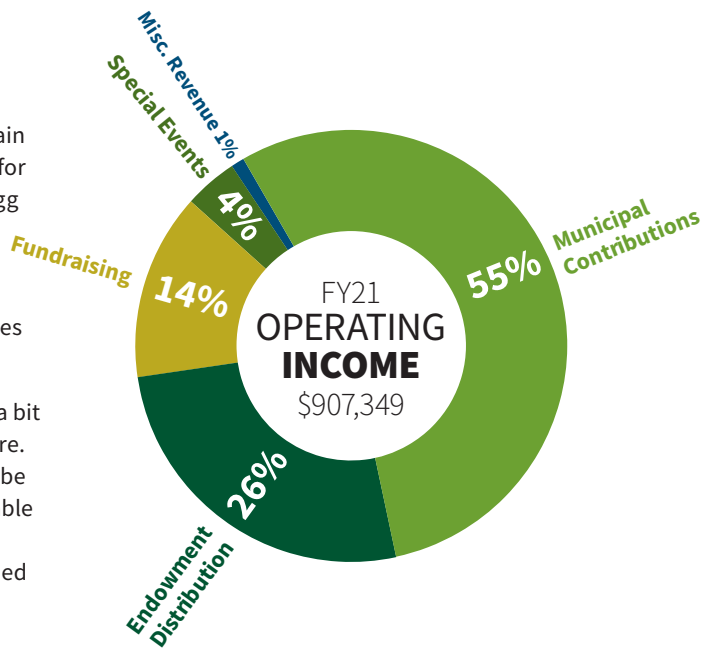
For a variety of reasons, our FY22 expenses were a bit lower than anticipated and our revenues a bit more. Library management and staff have continued to be creative in providing services in new and sustainable ways. Budget support was again strong on town meeting day as all six towns overwhelmingly passed their Library lines. Our donors have continued to make support of the Kellogg Hubbard Library a priority. And, we have again benefited from some one-time federal recovery funds.

With good stewardship of resources, the management and the board have continued to position the Library for a strong financial future by paying off remaining debt, adding to the endowment, attending to some important building maintenance, ensuring adequate reserves that permit us to respond to unanticipated future challenges, and, importantly, funding strategic planning. In short, the Library's already strong fiscal management has been strengthened further.

One challenge on the near horizon relates to the cost of participating in Montpelier's downtown district heat. The city continues to learn the full cost of operating this utility. The resulting uncertainty in predicting and controlling our heating costs will likely continue for the next several years.

Every five years, the Library submits its financial statements for external review. Such was the case with the FY21 financial statements resulting in a "clean" audit. The closing FY22 financial statements are still in progress and will be available in the fall.

Strategic Planning Update

We are now 6 months into our strategic planning process and nearing completion! In the spring we gathered over 150 survey responses from our community, interviewed key library partners, and conducted extensive brainstorming with our staff and trustees. Our strategic planning group has used all of that feedback to draft goals, which are now being reviewed and edited by the board and staff. We expect to finalize the plan in late September 2022.



FY22 HIGHLIGHTS

- **Our first full year without overdue fines!** 12 local businesses and many individuals helped support this transition.
- The Library was able to **stay open** through the Covid Delta and Omicron surges.
- **Carol Minkiewicz retired** after working 26 years at the Library. Thanks for everything, Carol!
- Donors helped us add **over \$120,000 to our endowment** this year!
- **New carpets** in the Children’s Library, the Hayes Room and the main lobby. In addition to the carpets, we completed **7 other Give the Library a Lift! projects.**
- Our new monthly sustainers and perpetual book sale are providing **reliable, steady monthly income.**
- **Paid off accrued debt** with support from Covid-related grants.
- **Replaced printers** in the library that we’ve owned since 2006.

DEI Initiatives



Libraries are meant for everyone, but how do we make sure we are providing equitable and inclusive services? Over the past year, we have been taking steps to prioritize inclusion and equity at the Kellogg-Hubbard Library. We want all of the members of our community to walk through our doors knowing: "The library is a place for me." We want the stories and resources that we provide to reflect a variety of perspectives, from culturally diverse to neurodiverse, all ages and abilities.



Building on a productive training in the fall, staff founded a Diversity, Equity & Inclusion committee to pursue ideas and initiatives throughout the Library. These efforts have included evaluating our building for opportunities to be more accessible and inviting, such as multilingual signage, and collaborating with Chief Don Stevens of the Nulhegan Band of the Coosuk, Abenaki Nation, on the development of a land acknowledgement to be posted in the Vermont Room.

Several staff members have also participated in DEI-focused professional development courses, including antiracist library culture and collection development courses funded by the Vermont Department of Libraries. The guidance from these trainings was shared with all members of library staff and is being used to steer collection development. Staff members have been applying a DEI lens when considering new items or deciding what to weed. In the children's library, an audit is underway where each item in the collection is looked at with a critical eye on representation. The items are tallied and the information paints a picture of the voices that are included in the library collection and helps guide decisions about items that are added. The goal is to assess and improve the collection to better reflect the diversity of the country and the world.

Finally, as the Library works towards the drafting of a strategic plan for the upcoming years, we have remained passionate about making diversity, equity, and inclusion our guideposts. These values are essential to what a public library is and does and are foundational to our vision for the Library's future.
